Literature, Language and Writing

Course Overview

In this literature and writing course, students will read a range of texts - a novel, short story/poem, and a nonfiction text - and gain the fundamentals of reading and writing with a literary focus. Students will read, discuss and analyze the literary and language elements of the various texts, synthesize original ideas, and transfer understanding to writing. Students who take all 4 weeks will be able to not only read a wide array of classic literature from diverse genres but also learn the basics of the 5 types of writing and complete a final essay writing assignment every week.
